2006 Water Revenue Adjustment

ITEM DESCRIPTION

At the November Utility Board meeting, staff presented alternative water revenue adjustments and the projected ability of each alternative to meet board policy requirements for cash reserves. The needed revenue increase reflected growth in operating costs, continued impact of community growth, relocation costs due to highway construction and the impact of conservation on sales.

The Board preliminarily agreed that a 5% increase for 2006 was needed to maintain continued reliable quality service, while maintaining a sound financial position. A notice of the proposed revenue adjustment was provided to the public via the paper of record. A 5% adjustment will result in an increase of approximately \$0.54 per month for a typical residential customer.

Staff recommends that the Board proceed with a recommendation to the City Council for increasing water rates by 5% effective January 1, 2006.

UTILITY BOARD ACTION REQUESTED:

- 1. Approve and recommend to the City Council a 5.0% water rate increase to all customer classes effective January 1, 2006.
- 2. Approve a resolution to approve the attached rate schedules effective January 1, 2006.
